

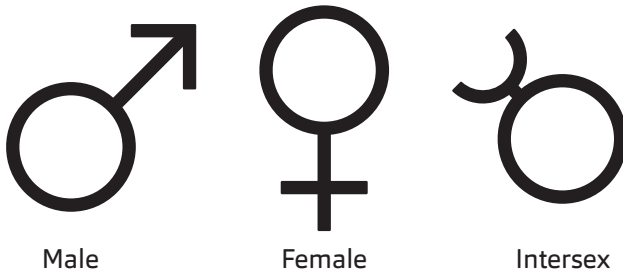

Sex assigned at birth is a limited way of thinking about gender. It only considers private body parts known as genitals.

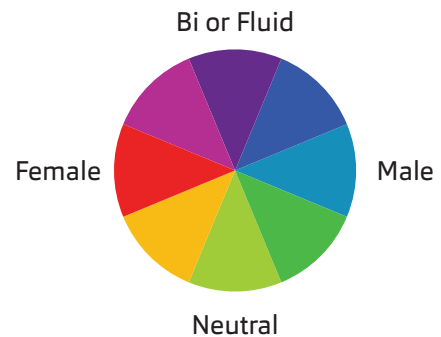

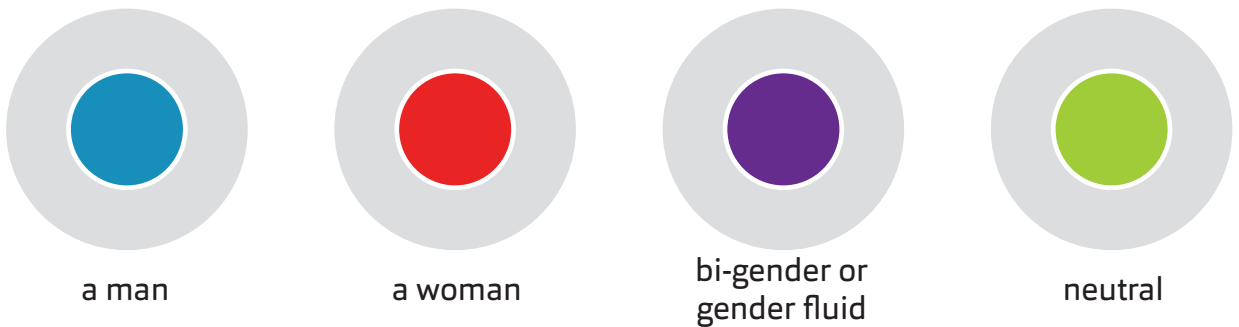
Intersex

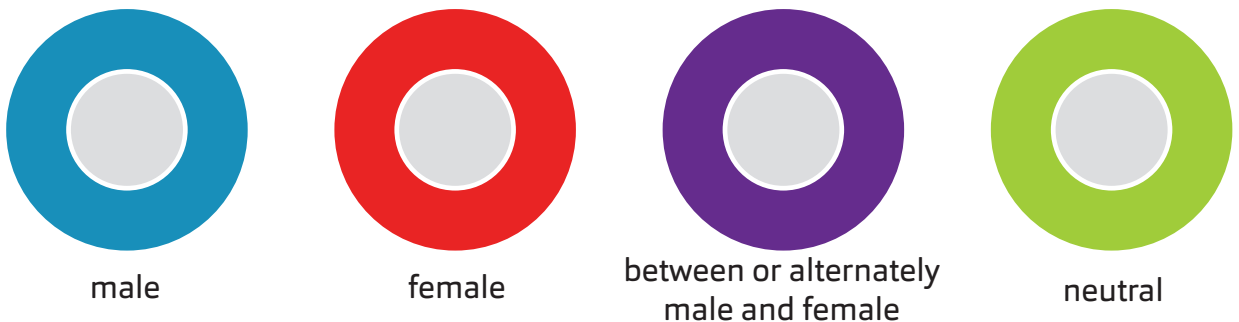

Sexual attraction



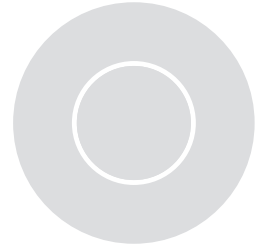

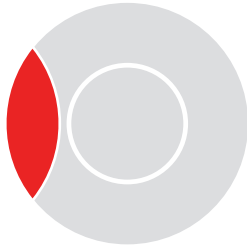

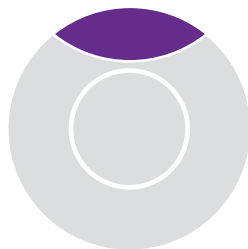
Emotional attraction

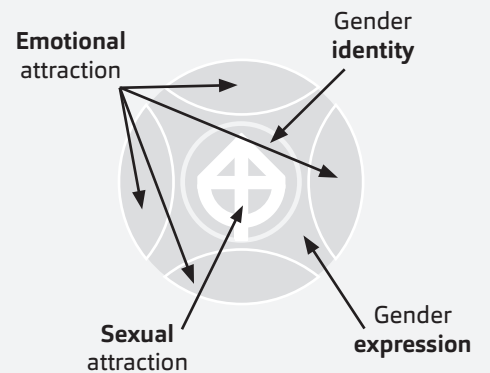
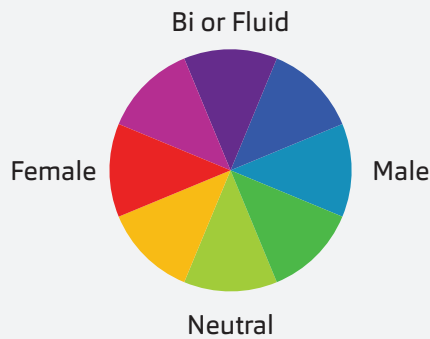
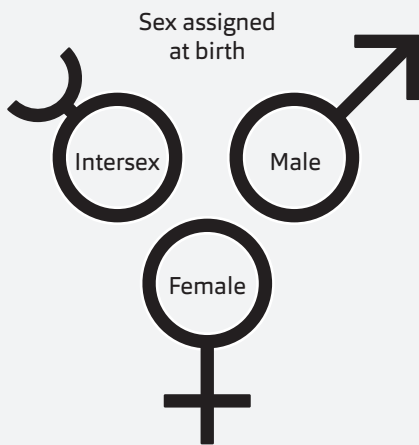
